

On Tuesday, July 31, 2012, father and son team: **Martin Demaine and Erik Demaine** will give a public talk with slides: a technical presentation focusing on the mathematics of origami at 5:30 p.m. at the Simons Center Gallery.

Dr. Erik Demaine joined the MIT faculty in 2001 at age 20, the youngest professor in the history of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. In 2003 he was awarded a MacArthur Fellowship. His PhD dissertation in the field of computational origami awarded him the Canadian Governor General's Gold Medal and the NSERC Doctoral Prize (2003) for the best PhD thesis and research in Canada (one of four awards).

Martin Demaine is an Artist-in-Residence at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
